Award Ceremony

On June 1st Officer Joseph Rehnert received the Officer of the Month award from the Central Ohio Crime Stoppers. He received this award for his life saving actions on October 31, 2015. Officer Rehnert successfully used his cruiser's automated external defibrillator (AED) and administered cardio pulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on a woman until medics could arrive and take over the life saving efforts.



Computer Aided Dispatch / Records Management System (CAD/RMS)

Late last year the city purchased a new CAD/RMS system for the police department. Implementation was expected to take up to a year.

Representatives from CAD/RMS vendor began working with our staff in June as part of the build process. In the months to come the department will be working on entering data and merging department operations with the new software. Once the software is fully implemented it will be used by every member of the department.

DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

June 2016

Safety Town

Camp opened June 6, 2016, and for the first time since inception all four of the primary sessions were held in June. There were 374 campers who attended which is 8% lower (35 campers) than last year. The two drivers of this decrease were the addition of Graduate Camp Pilot Program for 2nd year campers and a lower kindergarten registrations in the New Albany Plain Local School District. With the additional Graduate Camp being held in July there will be 446 campers this year vs 409 in 2015 for a 9% overall increase. This year also represents the most campers Safety Town has ever had in one year.

Adventureland continues to be a highlight of camp and the curriculum was updated to include the addition of a roundabout. The Adventureland site was also enhanced by adding the paver sidewalks and stone base to each of the buildings. Columbia Gas is a new partner for Safety Town this year providing a demonstration on Gas Safety with their companion, Digger Dog. For the first time a professional photographer, HR Imaging was invited to take pictures providing higher quality and a wider range of photographs for campers. Surveys will be sent to camp families and staff in July to once again gauge satisfaction levels and determine if additional enhancements can be added that will improve the quality of camp.
