DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

March 2016

Drug Arrest

On March 29, 2016, Officer Rehnert stopped a vehicle for speed on S.R. 161. After detecting a strong odor of marijuana, Officer Rehnert questioned the driver. The driver admitted to having a bag of marijuana in her possession and provided the officer with false identification. The officer searched the vehicle and also found a bag of cake-pops which is believed to have contained marijuana as one of its main ingredients. Once drug test results are obtained from the lab, the driver will likely be facing felony drug charges.



Hiring Update

The police department has completed background investigations on the applicants for the police clerk's position and the 911 dispatcher positions. Administrative skills testing was also completed this month for the police clerk applicants. The clerk's position should be filled by the end of April. Police officer applicants' background investigations have been progressing as scheduled and should be completed in April. Successful police officer applicants will be attending a police academy in August.

OVI Task Force Blitz

The police department deployed two additional officers as part of the Franklin County OVI Task Force's saturated patrol for St. Patrick's Day. The officers conducted nineteen traffic stops, issued six traffic citations and twelve warnings. The enforcement blitzes are intended to reduce the number of alcohol related crashes during holiday weekends.

New Recruits

On March 25th, 2016 Chief Jones and Sergeant Fernander attended the open house at the Ohio Highway Patrol's Academy. Two of the department's newest officers, Adam Klingler and Nate Ferguson are in the Patrol's Police Officer Academy. It was a great opportunity to meet the officers' families, review their training progress and visit with them during lunch. The officers will graduate in July and then begin their field training.



Fitness Challenge

Five members of the police department participated in Heit Center's Lets Move for a Better World challenge. The challenge was from March 6th through March 19th and the police department competed against the Plain Township Fire Department. Technogym equipment will be donated to the schools in the name of the challenge winners .

Robbery Conviction

On April 19, 2015 a man robbed the Subway at 9725 Johnstown Road in New Albany, the suspect implied he had a gun and forced the clerk to open the cash register, taking an undisclosed amount of cash. After a five month investigation a suspect was identified. Timothy Gentry confessed to the robbery during an interview with New Albany officers. On March 29, 2016 he was convicted of robbery and is awaits sentencing .
