Hiring Process

The current police officer hiring process was nearly completed in May. Several applicants were selected to move forward to complete the remaining steps of the process including: polygraph, medical and psychological exams. Once they are hired and complete their training, the department will increase its patrol staffing levels and begin moving forward with plans to begin the process to become Nationally Accredited.

Heather Cole and Teasa Wollenburg were hired as 911 emergency dispatchers in May. They have begun their training and are anticipated to complete the training in August. Previously, Heather managed online sales for large retailer and Teasa worked for a local hospital.

Police Executive Leadership College (PELC) Graduation

On May 20, 2016 Sergeant Kris Daniels graduated from the PELC Program hosted by the Law Enforcement Foundation (LEF) and the Ohio Association of Chiefs of Police (OACP). PELC was developed with the vision to develop dynamic, visionary leaders to effectively serve and protect our communities. Their mission is to provide unique and innovative leadership education geared towards today's demands and tomorrow's needs. Sergeant Daniels completed 14 days, with 105 class hours over three weeks. He completed 20 required readings, 13 journal entries, 5 research papers, 5 community interviews, 20 topics, 3 team projects, 3 speeches and listened to 15 instructors/speakers. We want to congratulate Sergeant Daniels on his accomplishment.

Founder's Day

The department provided 140 child IDs to families at the festival activities after the parade. The IDs are provided to the parents of young children so that the parents can quickly provide authorities with the child's photo, fingerprint and bio information in the event that the child is lost or has been abducted.

Chuck Hassey, Loni Burnip, Edith Weger, Bill Jones, and Kim Doran help keep people clear of the parade's path. People will sometimes encroach on the parade as they pick up candy tossed from parade members. As always, the city appreciates their assistance. D.A.R.E Graduation

On May 20, 2016 the department conducted the second 5th grade DARE graduation of the 2015-2016 school year. The ceremony consisted of four classes and over 100 students. Franklin County Sheriff's Office K-9 Deputy Copas and his partner, Atrey attended the ceremony and demonstrated how canines are utilized in law enforcement. The students particularly enjoyed the end of the demonstration when Deputy Copas sent Atrey to apprehend a "suspect," played by DARE Officer Kelly.

Arrest of Theft Suspect

On May 28, 2016 the department received a call from a resident who stated someone was breaking into their car. A responding officer saw the suspect running from the scene. The suspect then jumped into his vehicle and fled from the officer. After a pursuit the suspect was apprehended by the officer and it was discovered that the suspect had been driving a stolen car.

Unfortunately, thefts from vehicles generally increase in the warmer months. We encourage residents to lock their cars and to not leave valuables where thieves can see them. Simple steps like those can greatly reduce your chances of becoming a victim.
