### October 2016

#### Hiring

The city is nearing the end of a process that began in 2015 to fill vacant police office positions and to add additional patrol officers. Police officer applicants who successfully passed their physical fitness test in September were invited to a screener interview in October. Successful applicants were then moved on to the background process. The city anticipates completing this hiring process in December in time for the January academy.

### October 2016

On October 2nd the police department conducted the 21st Annual Cedar Brook neighborhood Block Watch picnic. Approximately 100 residents attended the event which ran from 4:30 p.m. through 6:30 p.m. Members from the Citizens Police Academy also spoke promoting the 2017 class. Attendees received information on recent crime trends and discussed proactive measures they can take to deter crime and improve safety.

### October 2016

#### **OVI Task Force**

The Franklin County OVI Task Force held their county-wide OVI Halloween traffic enforcement blitz during the weekend of October 29th through Halloween night. Officer Rehnert represented the police department and during the blitz stopped nine traffic violators issuing two speed citations, one stop sign violation, one citation for failing to yield to stationary public safety vehicle, and five traffic warnings.


#### **Citizen Police Academy Alumni**

The simulator is used in the schools, businesses and special events to educate young drivers about the danger of driving distracted.

## SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER

### October 2016

#### Projects and Programs:

On October 4<sup>th</sup> School Resource Officer Ryan Southers conducted the first safety drill of the school year at the middle school. During the drill he reviewed the run, hide and fight principals of the A.L.I.C.E. program and discussed several scenarios with the staff. The drills became mandatory for all schools in Ohio in 2015.

#### Run, Hide, Fight Training:

On October 25<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> New Albany Police Officer Southers along with Westerville Police Officer Pignatelli conducted five Response to Acts of Violence classes for Abercrombie & Fitch employees at their headquarters.
