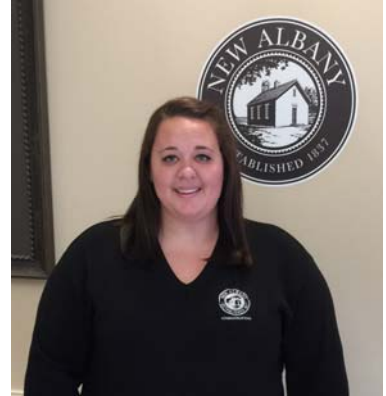

DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

April 2018

National Telecommunicator Week

Every year during the second week of April, the telecommunications personnel in the public safety community are honored. This week-long event, initially set up in 1981 by Patricia Anderson of the Contra Costa County Sheriff's Office in California, is a time to celebrate and thank those who dedicate their lives to serving the public. It is a week that should be set aside so everyone can be made aware of their hard work and dedication. Dispatcher Lindsay Allen was chosen as Dispatcher of the Year for continuing to be one step ahead during any call she receives. She is trustworthy a team player and is always there to assist.



New Police Clerk

The department welcomed a new Police Clerk, Lauren Johnson in April, her first day was on April 2, 2018. Lauren has begun her training and will complete her six week training program in May. Please join us in welcoming our newest staff member.

OHLEG Security Audit

Over the past few months the police department has completed several State of Ohio audits. Most of the audits were routine and one was triggered by the implementation of the new software system. The most recent audit was on the department's use of the Ohio Law Enforcement Gateway ("OHLEG"). The department was found to be in compliance with all of the rules and regulations governing the use of the State's system. The department passed and was shown to have a high degree of compliance in all of the recent audits.

LEADS Security Audit

The department underwent a Law Enforcement Automated Data System "LEADS" Security Audit to ensure we are following the security policy requirements. The audit revealed the department was out of compliance regarding some requirements. LEADS personnel indicated that is typical for an agency's first audit. The department has until May 14th to remedy those items.

2018 Drug Take Back

On April 26, 2018 the police department teamed up with the Drug Enforcement Agency's (DEA) Drug Take Back Initiative. The event was held at the Plain Township Fire Department and it gave citizens the opportunity to turn in unwanted medications for destruction. Thirty pounds of unwanted medication was collected and removed from homes where the medications could have been abused, accidentally ingested or disposed of improperly. Participating in this event was a great addition to the city's drug drop box located in the lobby of the police department and is available to receive unwanted medications at any time.

DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

April 2018

D.A.R.E. Graduation

Approximately 200 fifth grade students graduated from the D.A.R.E. program on April 26, 2018. Officer Kelly presented the certificates and hosted the Franklin County Sheriff's Office K-9 team to conduct a live demonstration.

Community Conversation on Safety

On April 9, 2018 the city participated in the schools Community Conversation on Safety. The event brought together officials from the City of New Albany, Plain Local Schools, and Plain Township to discuss current safety practices and procedures. The community also asked many questions on a variety of topics including drugs, school security and legislative efforts.

Bike Safety Class

On April 26th Officer Southers conducted a bike safety class at AEP. This was the second year that the event was held at AEP as part of their annual Take Your Kids to Work Day. Officer Southers inspected the children's bikes, made minor adjustments, and set up three bicycle maneuverability courses for the children in attendance.
