## DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

### August 2017

#### Pelotonia

The weekend of August 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>, the City of New Albany hosted a starting point, two finish lines and rest stops for the 2017 Pelotonia. New Albany Officers were stationed throughout the route to ensure the safety of the estimated 8,200 cyclists who traveled through and to the city as part of the ride for charity. No issues or problems were reported and cyclist and motorist demonstrated patience as they shared the road.

The police department participated in the New Albany Service Department's annual Touch-a-Truck event. In addition to displaying a police cruiser the police department provided child IDs to the families in attendance.

#### DogFest Walk'n Roll

On August 12<sup>th</sup>, Officer Burr assisted with the Canine Companions Dog Fest WALK'N ROLL held on Market Square. According to the Canine Camanions for Independence website, they are "a non-profit organization that enhances the lives of people with disabilities by providing highly trained assistance dogs and ongoing support to ensure quality partnerships. Headquartered in Santa Rosa, CA, Canine Companions is the largest non-profit provider of assistance dogs, and is recognized worldwide for the excellence of its dogs, and the quality and longevity of the matches it makes between dogs and people. The result is a life full of increase and loving companionship".



#### Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over

The City of New Albany Police Department participated in the state of Ohio's Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over initiative. This stems from block granting given to states from the National Highway Traffic and Safety Administration (NHTSA). NHTSA requests additional patrol activity for unlicensed drivers, moving violations, impaired driving, safety belt violations and other traffic related issues in an effort to promote safer roadways, especially during holiday weekends. Between August 18<sup>th</sup> and September 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2017 officers made 167 traffic stops resulting in: 6 OVI arrests, 5 seat belts citations, 41 speed citations, 43 "other" type citations, 12 driving with suspended license violations and 1 felony arrest.

### August 2017

#### First Friday

On August 4<sup>th</sup>, Officer Southers attended a community event called First Friday in Delaware, Ohio hosted by the City of Delaware. This particular First Friday event featured a “Cruiser Cruise In” where the Ohio State Patrol, sheriff’s departments, and local municipalities all sent representatives from their respective departments. Officer Southers attended in the department’s pick up which was huge hit with the children and adults alike.

## DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

### August 2017

#### Fatal Crash

The City had its first fatal crash of 2017 on US 62 north of Smith's Mill Road. The fatality was a passenger in a car that was struck as it was making a left turn at an intersection. The road had to be closed and traffic was diverted for hours for the crash investigation. The department uses equipment and software, similar to what land surveys use, to map the crash scene.



#### Specialized Training

On August 24<sup>th</sup>, New Albany bike officers received specialized firearms and maneuverability training. Working from and around a bike is much different than a police cruiser or building. The intent of this type of training is to reflect the duties and challenges of officers on bike patrol.
