DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

March 2018

Ohio Collaborative for Law Enforcement

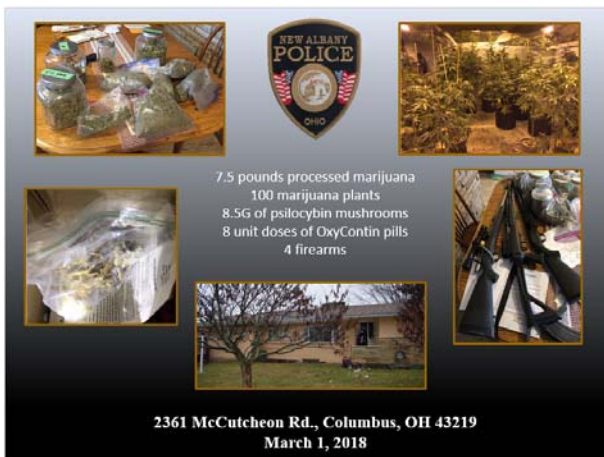
The City of New Albany Police Department was successfully credentialed through the Ohio Collaborative—Ohio Office of Criminal Justice Services in March. This initiative established by Governor Kasich works to improve community-police relations and find solutions to the tensions and concerns between community members and the police that serve them. As part of this year's process the department submitted policies surrounding Use of Force in Response to Resistance and Community Policing policies for review.



Narcotics Search

After a two month investigation, the New Albany Police Department executed a narcotics search warrant on March 1, 2018 at 2361 McCutcheon Road. Upon entering the residence, officers recovered 4 firearms, approximately 7.5 pounds of processed marijuana, 100 marijuana plants, OxyContin pills and psilocybin mushrooms.

On March 15, 2018, after completing three undercover narcotics buys, the New Albany Police Department executed a narcotics search warrant at 2229 Hedgerow Road, Apt. F. 1 ounce of marijuana, 1 ounce of marijuana concentrate and 4 marijuana plants were recovered.



Department Meeting

The police department held its annual department meeting in March. The meeting included sexual harassment and ethics training. The meeting gives the department an opportunity to complete department wide training, update all staff on future plans and build comradery by having all department personnel in one meeting.

Citizen Police Academy

The 2018 joint New Albany-Gahanna Citizens Police Academy graduated in March. Participants enjoyed a free 10-week community education program that highlighted the values, mission, and operations of the New Albany Police Department and Gahanna Police Department. Not only has this program afforded both agencies an opportunity to work together and share experiences, participants gained the combined knowledge and efforts brought forth by subject-matter experts. New Albany Students Walk Out

On March 14th, New Albany High School students walked out as part of a nationwide event. The student led protest was in favor of gun control in response to the school shooting in Parkland, Florida. Although it was not a school-sanctioned event, the department worked with school administrators to provide additional officers and security measures.
