## DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

### May 2018

#### Founder's Day Parade

On May 19, 2018 the city held its annual Founders Day celebration. Events included a parade through the city center and a carnival. Officers worked to ensure a safe community event by completing pre-planning with the organizers and city's service department. Additionally, officers completed a site safety check, directed traffic and provided security at the carnival. The police department also provided over 150 child id's for the families in attendance.



#### Honor Ride 2018

On May 26, 2018 officers aided the annual Project Hero Honor Ride event. This event gathers cyclists from around the state to participate in 12, 32, and 67 mile rides through Franklin and Licking counties. 90% of the proceeds are donated to injured veterans. The event had double the participants this year and went very well.

#### Click it or Ticket

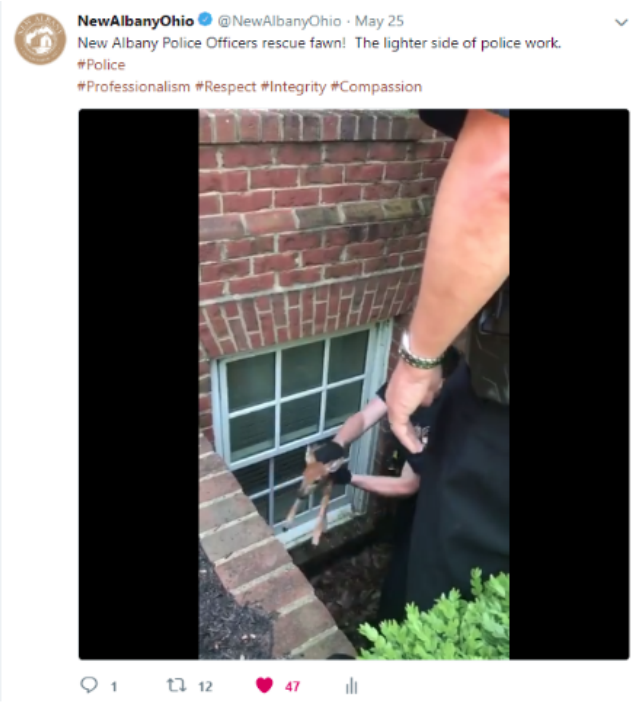
This month officers participated in the Ohio Traffic Safety Office's National Enforcement Mobilization "Click it or Ticket" initiative. Click it or Ticket runs from May 21 through June 3. During this period officers focus on traffic enforcement for moving violations, suspended drivers, safety belt use and OVI's in an effort to increase the safety of motorists on Ohio public roadways during the beginning of summer and Memorial holiday weekend. Final statistics will be available in June.

#### Fawn Rescued

Officer Catanese saved a fawn after it fell into a window well of a home located in the County Club community. A video was taken and shared on the city's social media platforms (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram)

#### Bike Helmets and Ice Cream

The city is partnering with Johnson's Ice Cream this summer to provide children with a coupon for a free scoop of ice cream if an officer sees them wearing a helmet when they are riding a bike. The program was launched in late May and will run through the summer. Several coupons have already been handed out and redeemed. The partnership is a great opportunity to promote bicycle safety and it gives the police department another opening to build positive relationships with local children and families.
