### January 2018

#### Law Enforcement Appreciation Breakfast

### **January 2018**

#### **Citizen Police Academy**

On January 17th the police department began its 2nd Annual Joint Citizen Police Academy with Gahanna Police Department. This year's academy class has 29 students. The first class was held on January 17th with an Introduction and a Tour of the New Albany Police Facility. The academy is an ten week program with the last class concluding on March 14th with a graduation ceremony for the students.

#### **Newest Officer**

January 16th the city welcomed its newest edition to the police department. Oren Nauman was sworn in as a full-time police officer. Oren comes to the department from the Newark Police Department, where he was an officer for a year. He graduated from the Columbus Police Academy in January of 2016. Oren has a Bachelors degree in business administration from the Ohio State University. Officer Nauman is now in the field training program and is expected to complete his training in April. Please join us in welcoming Officer Nauman to the department.

#### **Netcare Access**

Representatives from Netcare Access rode with officers on patrol as part of their effort to share information about their services. Netcare Access provides support to people who are having a mental health crisis and provides comprehensive evaluations and assessments for the courts and community agencies including police departments. They have often been a resource for the New Albany Police Department and law enforcement agencies in the central Ohio area. The information provided will help the police department work effectively with Netcare Access and their effort to reach out to the officers on patrol was appreciated.

#### **School Resource Officer**

The New Albany Schools made several changes to their building uses and campus traffic flows this school year. To help facilitate the efficient flow of campus traffic, School Resource Officer Southers and DARE Officer Kelly have been assisting the school busses exiting onto State Route 605 at the end of the school day. Officer Southers has also been monitoring the flow of traffic on and off campus and has provided his thoughts to the schools and the city. His knowledge of the area traffic patterns and his enforcement has been helpful.
