### **February 2019**

#### **Provisional Certification**

The City of New Albany Police Department successfully received provisional certification from the Ohio Collaborative. The Ohio Collaborative Advisory Board was created by the governor's office to improve community-police relations and find solutions to the tensions and concerns between community members and the police that serve them through policy standardization, community outreach and data collection. The department submitted its policies and directives with requested documentation outlining agency initiatives in community engagement, response to resistance investigations, recruitment and hiring, tele-communicator training standards, bias free policing data analysis and policies surrounding investigations of reported employee misconduct. The police department received its initial Collaborative Certification in 2018 and looks forward to receiving its second full certification in March, 2019

#### **New Officers in Academy**

New Officer Michael Cohrs began the Columbus Police Academy in December, 2018. On February 26<sup>th</sup>, Sergeant Garrett Fernander was on hand to watch Officer Cohrs complete his boxing final. Officer Cohrs performed very well and passed the final test. He will graduate from the twenty nine week academy this summer.

Officers Codey Ratliff and Chase Blankenship began the Ohio Highway Patrol's Basic Police Academy in February. They will complete twenty two weeks of training in basic law enforcement including firearms, defensive tactics, criminal law, domestic violence responses, dynamic driving and many other topics. We wish them luck and look forward to their successful graduation.

#### **Firearms Legal Update Training**

Members of the Franklin County Prosecutor's Office Gun Unit provided a four hour legal update for the New Albany Police Department. The training provided a legal overview and current case law related to criminal cases involving firearms. The training was held at the police department and was recorded to be used in future in service training.
