Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies

We are proud to announce that the New Albany Police Department was awarded National Accreditation through the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA). The department has joined 66 other agencies out of approximately 1,000, law enforcement agencies in Ohio who are accredited. Through the efforts of the entire police department, the Commission found that the department was in full compliance with all 155 applicable standards covering every aspect of our public safety mission.

The three year process included a self-assessment step where policies and operations were brought into compliance with CALEA's proven standards. At the end of the self-assessment the department participated in two mock assessments before beginning the CALEA web-based assessment and the on-site assessment. CALEA assessors then submitted their report to the Commission for consideration. During the national conference in Covington, Kentucky, the department participated in a public review hearing to discuss the findings of the assessment. The final credentialing decision was made by the Board of CALEA Commissioners on November 16th.

Property Destruction

When the police department's property room reaches its maximum capacity, the department purges items that are contraband, unclaimed property, or are no longer needed as evidence. In compliance with the Ohio Revised Code and with the courts authorization, the department destroyed, donated or converted to department use over 2180 items this past month. The property destruction process is lengthy and disposing of the items took several days.





DARE Graduation

2019 Fall DARE classes began on September 3rd and graduation was held at the McCoy Center for the Performing Arts on November 25th. 191 fifth graded graduated from the twelve week fall session. The remaining fifth graders will begin the twelve week program on February 3, 2020.

Firearms Training



K9 Amigo Deployment Summary

For the month of November, Amigo conducted 19 detection deployments and was one of several K-9s involved in a drug sniff exercise conducted at New Albany High School and Middle School. The drug sniff exercise was conducted with the cooperation of the school district and used K-9 units from Officer Rehnert's training group. A total of eight K-9 units were used in the high school, middle school, and two of the student parking lots. In addition to the school exercise, Amigo had 22 paraphernalia indications and 18 drug indications, including marijuana, methamphetamine, crack cocaine, and psychedelic mushrooms.

III. Activity Detail

Chaplain activities this month included attending an After-Action review, making several station visits, and providing support and ministry to personnel. I attended meetings of the Central Ohio Law Enforcement Chaplains Team (hosted by NAPD) and the Mid-Ohio Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) team.

Dispatcher Mary Ham and I participated in the *First Responder Mental Health and Wellness Training* on November 7th and 8th. Presenters from Arizona, Idaho, and Washington shared their experiences and provided attendees with resources, mental health tools, and information to implement within their departments and communities. By discussing the real 21st century issues that are consistently facing our first responders and their families, this training provided awareness, resources, and action items to combat PTSD, depression, suicide, addiction, and stress. We had the opportunity to learn about national best practices in overall mental health and about wellness programs.
