

A PROCLAMATION RECOGNIZING JUNE 19 AS JUNETEENTH NATIONAL FREEDOM DAY IN NEW ALBANY

WHEREAS, President Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation on January 1, 1863, declaring all slaves in Confederate States to be free, a symbolic and important shift in national policy and setting the stage for the permanent abolishment of slavery in the United States; and

WHEREAS, the Civil War ended with the surrender of General Lee and the Confederate Army on April 9, 1865; and

WHEREAS, the town of Galveston, Texas marked what many believe to be the final place in the United States to receive notice that all slaves were free and the Civil War ended when Union General Gordon Grander arrived and issued a pronouncement on June 19, 1865; and

WHEREAS, slavery in the United States was formally abolished by the ratification of the 13th Amendment by the states on December 18, 1865; and

WHEREAS, June 19th – known as Juneteenth, has special meaning to African Americans, and has been commemorated for over 150 years as a day of remembrance and celebration; and

WHEREAS, by law, the State of Ohio designates the nineteenth day of June as Juneteenth National Freedom Day, acknowledging the freedom, history, and culture that June 19, 1865 has come to symbolize; and

WHEREAS, the City of New Albany is a community that welcomes all, celebrates the freedoms each of us enjoys, and wishes to inspire and encourage future generations.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Sloan T. Spalding, Mayor of the City of New Albany, Counties of Franklin and Licking, State of Ohio, on behalf of Council and the residents of New Albany, recognize June 19th as **JUNETEENTH NATIONAL FREEDOM DAY** and encourage members of our community to reflect on their freedoms, appreciate the history of struggle against slavery that led to liberation, and acknowledge the perseverance of African Americans against racism and inequality.
