Environmental Permits Needed and Public Involvement Process

There are two main environmental permits Intel will need for its facility: an isolated wetland permit for wetlands impacts and air permits

Isolated Wetland Permit

Anyone who wishes to discharge dredged or fill material into isolated wetlands in Ohio must obtain an Isolated Wetland Permit from Ohio EPA.

Public Participation Opportunities and Permit Process:

- Ohio EPA must determine whether an application is complete within 15 business days and notify the applicant in writing if the application is complete.
- Ohio EPA issues a public notice after determining the application is complete.
- The public will have 30 days following the publication of the public notice to provide comments.
- Ohio EPA will be conducting a public hearing for this project.
- At least 30 days prior to Ohio EPA's public hearing, the Agency will issue a public notice on the details of the hearing.

An applicant must present an evaluation of alternatives and discuss the social and economic impacts that will result from the project. Ohio EPA must issue or deny the application within 180 days of it being deemed complete.
