#### DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS April 2024

#### **Dispatcher Week**

#### DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS April 2024

#### New Department Staff

Jill Peters was recently hired as a police officer and began the Columbus Police Department's Basic Training Academy on April 15th. The academy is approximately six months long, and upon graduation, she will complete a nearly four-month field training program where she will be partnered with veteran officers for additional training.

The communications center also welcomed two new dispatchers this month, Tristan Van Hook and Yusupha Sillah. They will complete on-the-job training and telecommunicator courses through the Association of Public Safety Communication Officials (APCO).



#### **License Plate Readers**

Last year, the city installed several license plate reader cameras (LPR) along city streets. Since the installation, the LPRs have helped the department solve crimes and apprehend suspects. One recent success came when the LPRs notified the officers on patrol and the dispatchers that a camera had located a stolen car entering New Albany. Fortunately, an officer was close and was able to intercept the stolen car. The officer stopped the suspect and arrested him for the theft without incident. The car had been stolen from a bank parking lot just four hours before the stop. The victim was a woman who entered the bank but left her car running.

#### Drug Take Back Event

The department participated in the RX Take Back, which was held at the Plain Township Fire Department. Officers Downing and Mills received unwanted medications from the community that were then turned over to the DEA for destruction. The officers collected 64 pounds of medication that could have otherwise been abused or ended up being disposed of improperly.

#### K9 Amigo Deployment Summary


During the month of April, Amigo and his handler conducted ten detection deployments with seven indications, resulting in the seizure of 15 items and two arrests.

Amigo and Officer Rehnert also participated in a multi-agency K9 sweep at the New Albany Plain Local School Learning Campus. This was part of a proactive plan to promote a safe and drug-free environment on the school campus.
