KDC/One Incident

On February 4, 2025, a tragic act of violence took place at KDC/One, a global manufacturing company in the City of New Albany, where an KDC/One employee opened fire, claiming the lives of two individuals and injuring four others. Amid the chaos, a couple of other employees of the company acted with incredible bravery, risking their own lives to disarm the shooter and prevent further harm.

The assailant then fled the scene moments before officers arrived. Numerous local, state, and federal agencies responded to help search and secure the large facility, process the crime scene, and begin the work of locating the assailant. Within twelve hours of the shooting, the assailant was located and arrested.

We recognize the men and women of the New Albany Police Department, our law enforcement partners, and area fire departments whose quick actions aided the injured, protected the innocent and worked to apprehend the assailant. Our condolences go out to the families of the two men who were killed. We support the victims and are committed to completing a thorough investigation.




During the month of February, Amigo and his handler conducted six deployments with three indications, resulting in the seizure of 7 items and one arrest.










ACCIDENT BY TYPE
