A Train Near Magdeburg

City staff lead the discussion:

A TRAIN NEAR MAGDEBURG is the story of a trainload of 2500 Jewish souls headed for extermination at the hands of the Nazis, and a handful of brave American soldiers from the U.S. 30th Infantry and 743 Tank Battalion who saved the lives of twice as many lives as those on Schindler's list. The story also chronicles a high school teacher's journey of bringing to light this hidden story from the past and the incredible events that followed. A team of Emmy award winning filmmakers is completing work on a four-part miniseries which will bring this incredible story to life.
