HART Event

On March 6th, the New Albany Police Department held an opioid awareness event for parents and community members titled “Hidden in Plain Sight”. The program is administered by Health, Awareness and Recovery Together (HART) and is funded by a state grant for opioid prevention and education. Attendees were given information on narcotic and alcohol abuse in adolescents; including a mock bedroom set-up to allow parents an opportunity to see commonly used paraphernalia and hiding places to search. Following this presentation, attendees had an opportunity to ask questions of the School Resource Officers, D.A.R.E. officer, patrol officers, probation officer and K9 officer. Additional presenters included; Plain Township Fire, Columbus Fire (REACT Team), Concord Counseling Center, Franklin County Public Health, New Albany– Plain Local Schools, and the Alcohol Drug and Mental Health Board of Franklin County (ADAMH). Attendees had an opportunity to receive free Naloxone doses, gun locks, literature and other resources provided by attending organizations.

The communications center welcomes a new dispatcher, Arriannah Stoll. Ari comes to the department from the retail industry and she will begin on the job training and telecommunicator courses.

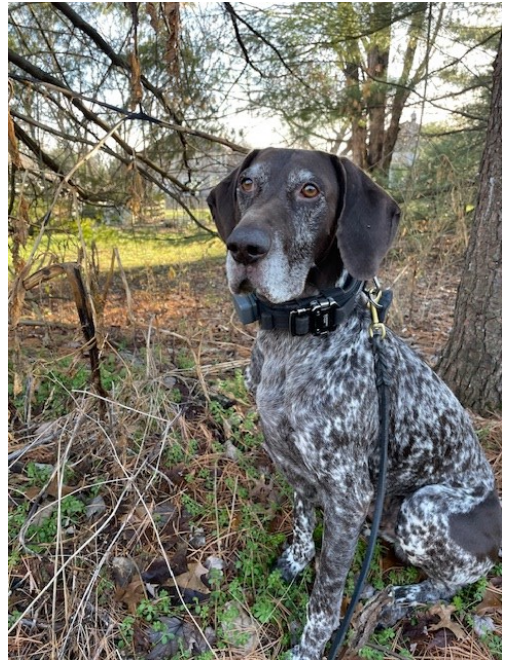

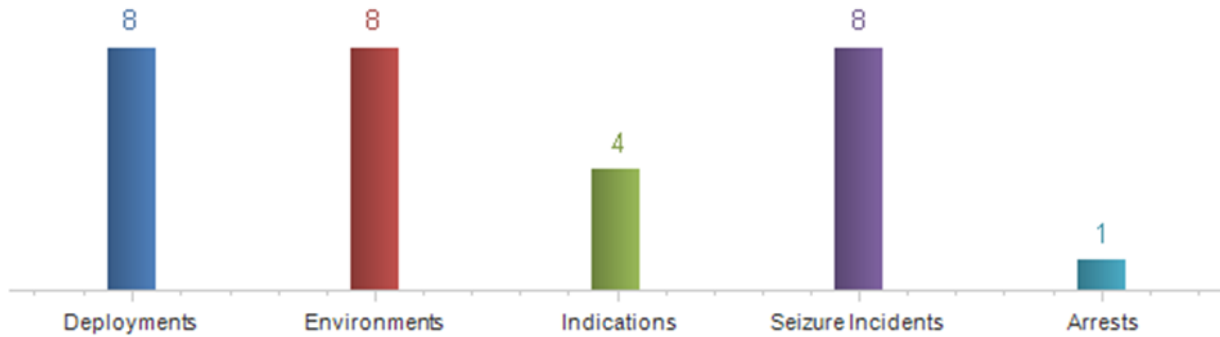
K9 Amigo Deployment Summary

During the month of March, Amigo and his handler conducted eight deployments with four indications, resulting in the seizure of eight items and one arrest.



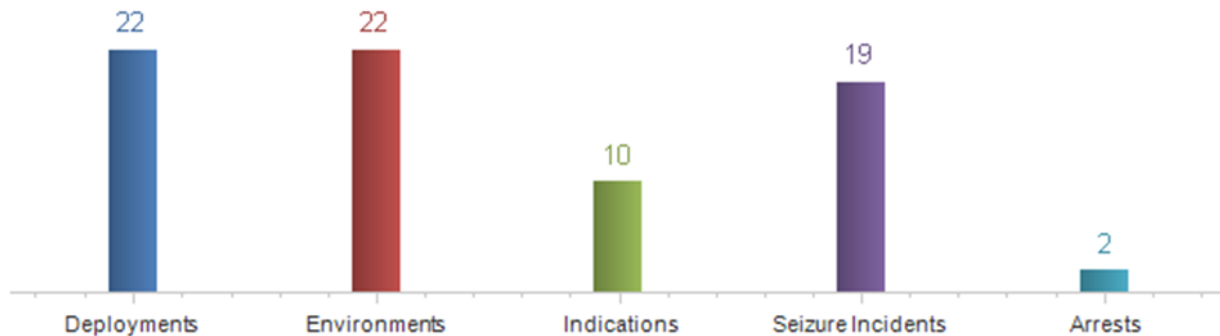

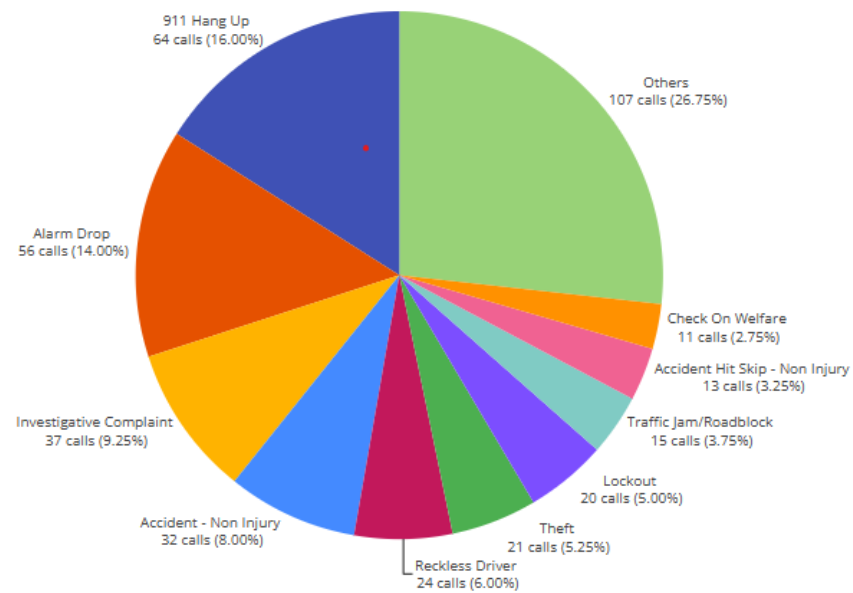

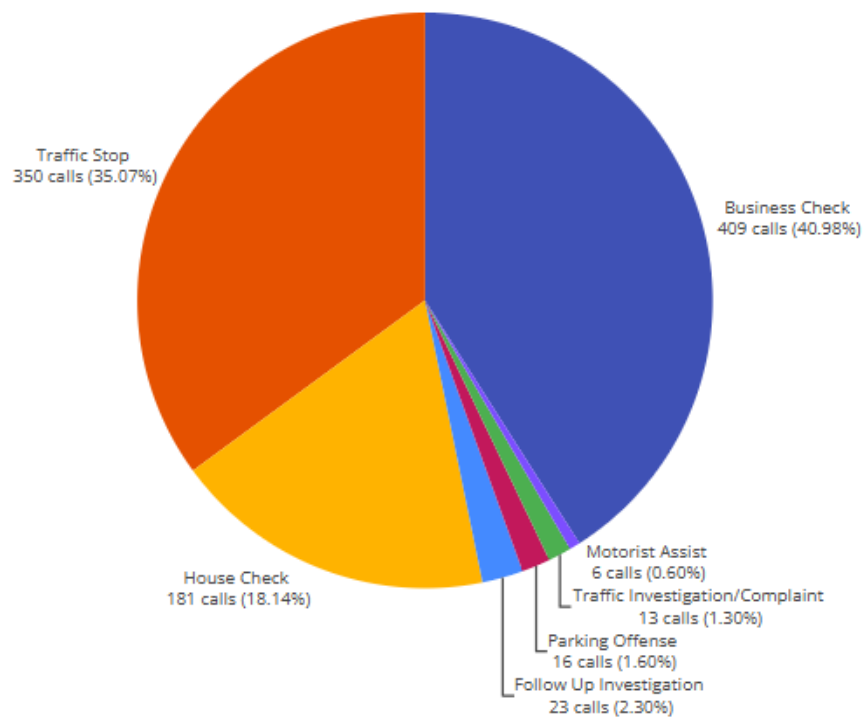

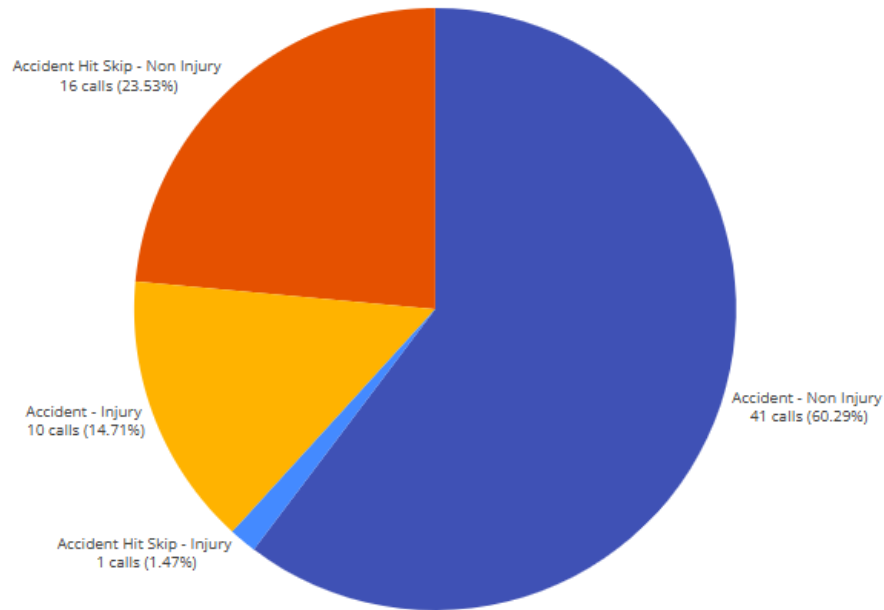

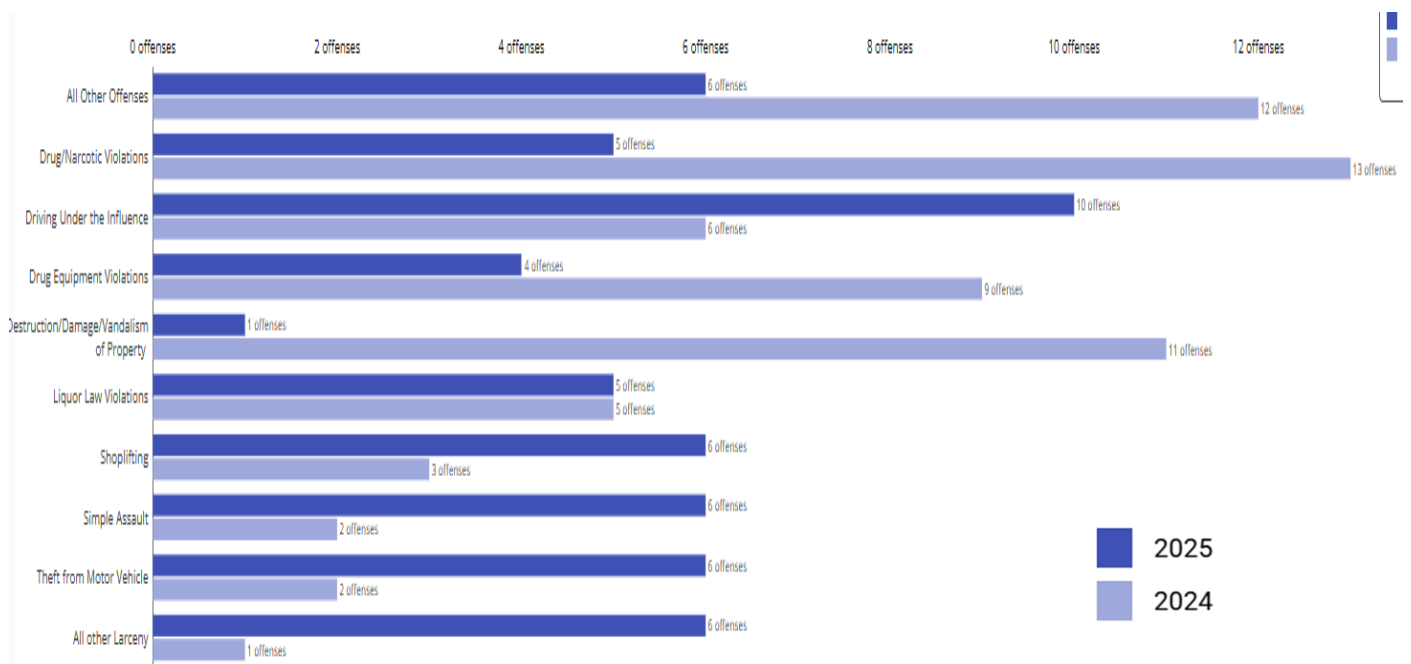

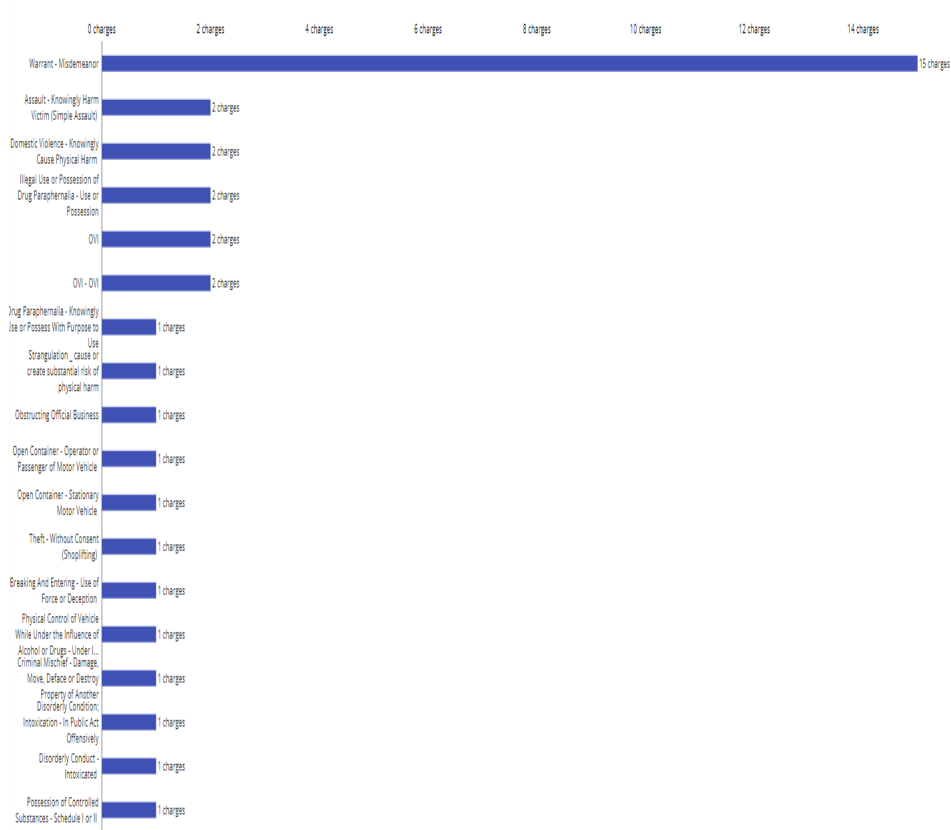
ACCIDENT BY TYPE
