
K9 Amigo Deployment Summary

During the month of May, Amigo and his handler conducted five detection deployments with one indication.


Officer Rehnert and K9 Amigo also did a demonstration for the 2024 D.A.R.E. graduates at their ceremony this month.





ACCIDENT BY TYPE




OFFENSES—TOP 10 WITH COMPARISON PERIOD
