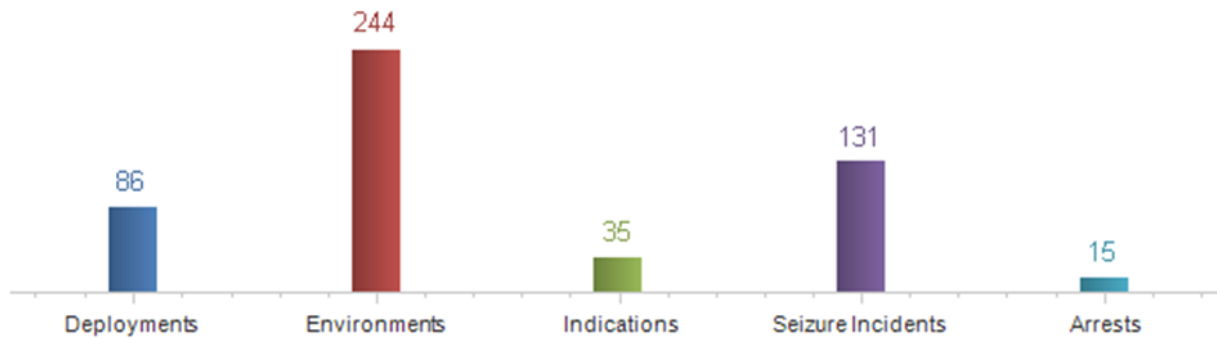

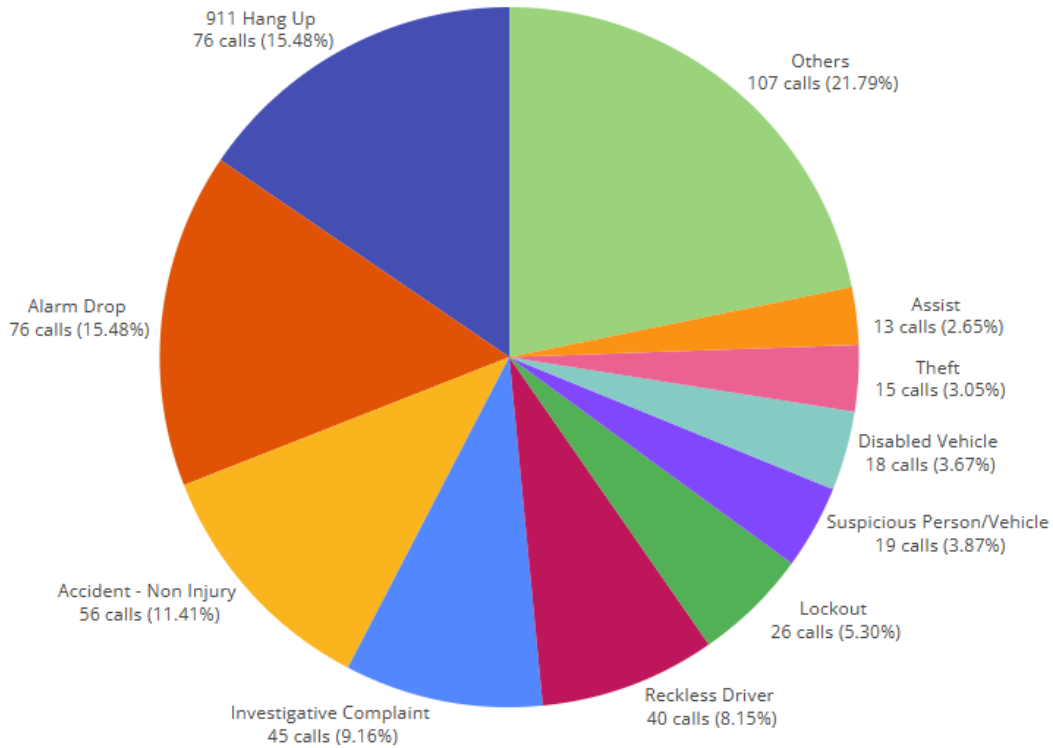

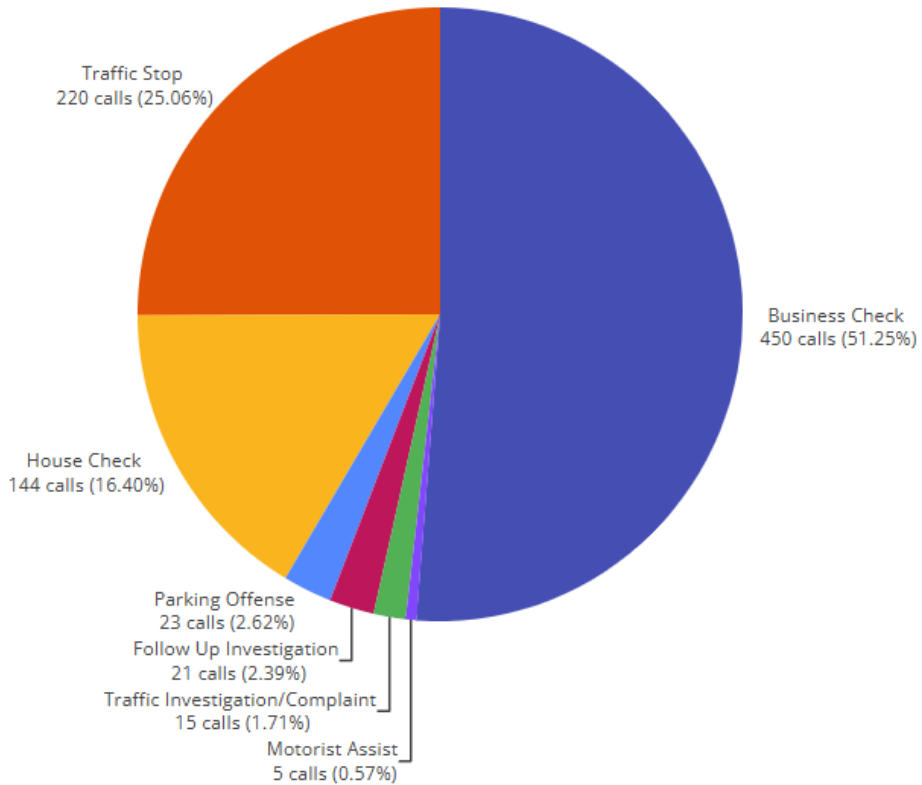

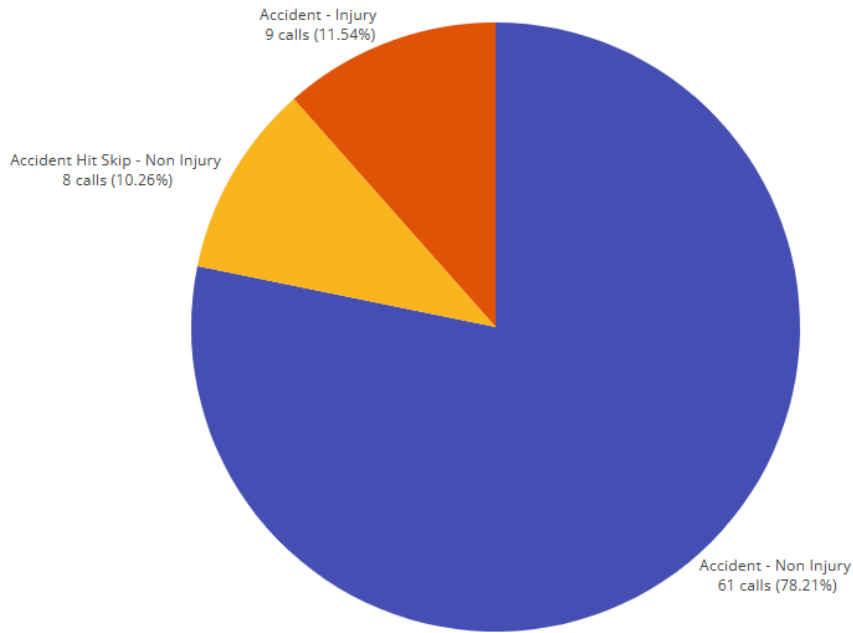

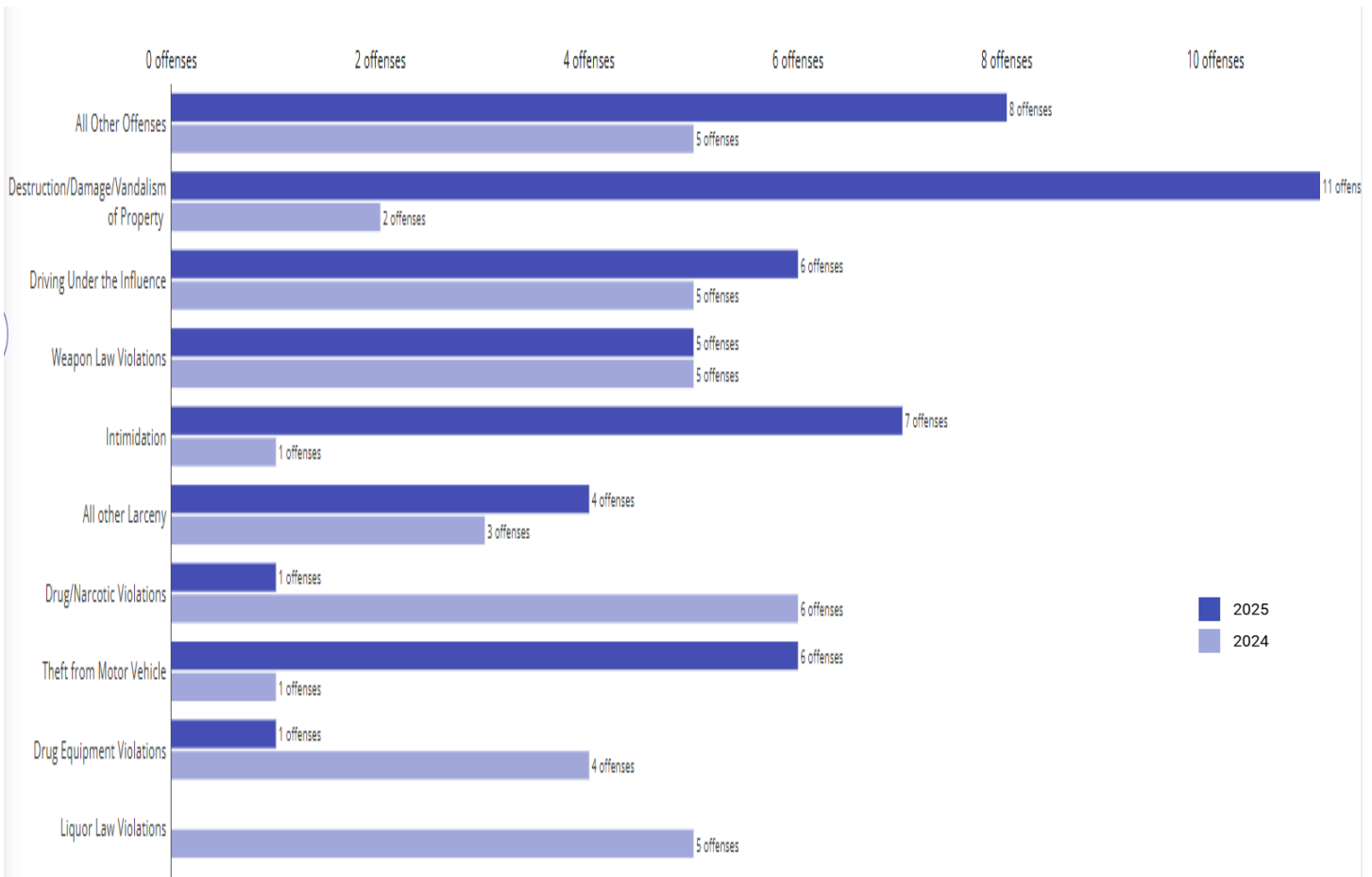

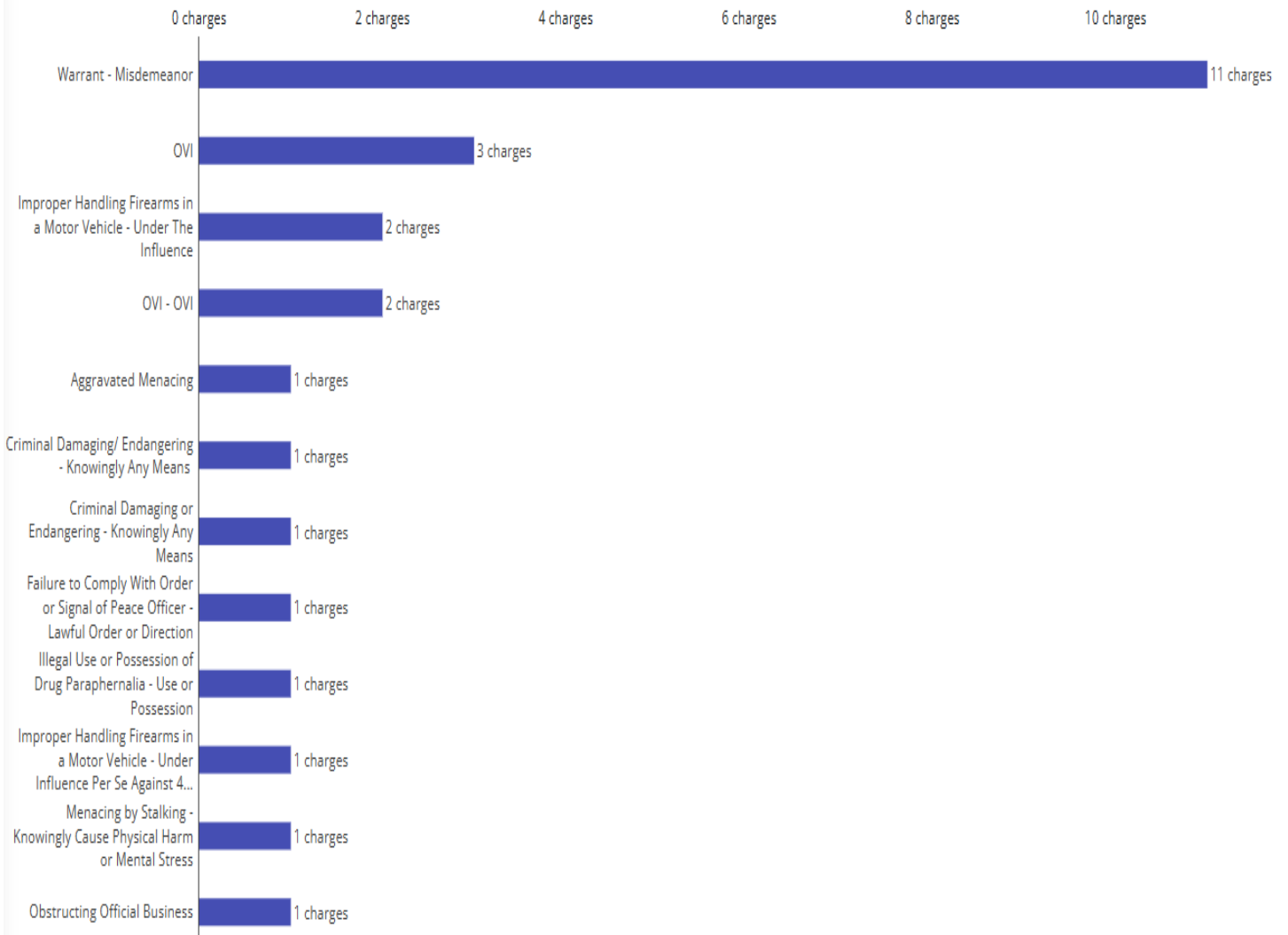
ACCIDENT BY TYPE
